PETITION TO CUMULATE VOTES

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS PROVIDED FOR THE GUIDANCE OF CANDIDATES FOR PUBLIC OFFICE WHO BELIEVE THAT CERTAIN NAMES WRITTEN-IN ON OFFICIAL ELECTION BALLOTS WERE INTENDED FOR VOTES FOR THEIR CANDIDACY NOTWITHSTANDING THE FACT THAT THE NAME WRITTEN-IN ON THE BALLOT MISSPELLS OR OTHERWISE MISIDENTIFIES THEM. THE FOLLOWING IS INTENDED FOR GUIDANCE ONLY AND, IN THE EVENT OF ANY QUESTION PERTAINING TO ANY PARTICULAR CANDIDATE, THE CANDIDATE SHOULD CONSULT WITH THEIR OWN ATTORNEY.

If a candidate determines it appropriate to request the cumulation of votes cast under different names at any election the following procedure is recommended.

- 1. The candidate shall present a petition to cumulate votes to the Franklin County Board of Elections not later than five (5) days after certification by the County of the votes cast at the Municipal Election. For the election conducted on November 4, 2025, the petition must be presented **not later than 4:30 p.m., Monday, November 17, 2025** at the offices of the Franklin County Commissioners located at 272 North Second Street, Chambersburg, Pennsylvania. The petition must physically be filed by this deadline postmarks do not count.
- 2. The candidate must give notice of the filing and the time and place set for hearing to all of the other candidates who appear to have been nominated for the office for which cumulation is being requested. Notice must be given in a timely manner to permit interested parties opportunity to attend the hearing. Notices shall be given by certified mail, return receipt requested, by personal delivery or delivery by a Pennsylvania Constable or by utilizing Certificate of Mailing which certifies the date of mailing and to whom. If notice is given via personal delivery or delivery by a Pennsylvania Constable, an acceptance of service signed by the person being served or an affidavit of service must be executed by the server as proof of delivery to all interested parties.
- 3. While there is no legally defined form for the petition to cumulate, it is important that the petition clearly identify the office involved in the petition, the identity of the candidate seeking to cumulate votes, and the name sought to be cumulated. For guidance of the candidates seeking cumulation, there is attached a form of petition that has been accepted in past years.
- 4. At the hearing before the Franklin County Board of Elections, the candidate must appear and must be prepared to prove to the satisfaction of the Board of Elections that the names sought to be cumulated are, in fact, intended to be votes for the candidate petitioning for cumulation. The candidate must also present evidence that the notice referenced in paragraph 2 above was in fact sent, and received, by all of the other candidates who appear to have been nominated for the same office.

The petition must be signed at the end with a verification statement by the candidate. The form is a sample only, and may need to be adapted to your particular circumstances. While the sample petition attached makes provision for the signature of the attorney, the law does not require that you hire an attorney to present your case. However, should you have any questions, retaining the services of an attorney may be helpful in the presentation of your petition.
