

FRANKLIN/FULTON DRUG & ALCOHOL

Franklin/Fulton Drug and Alcohol (FFDA) is the Single County Authority (SCA) responsible for the administration, oversight and delivery of drug and alcohol prevention, intervention, treatment, recovery and case management services for residents of Franklin and Fulton counties. FFDA works under contract with the Pennsylvania Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs (DDAP) to ensure a full range of locally based, high-quality substance use services are available and accessible to eligible residents.

Residents of both counties may contact FFDA for assistance accessing services. Family members and loved ones may also contact FFDA for information, guidance and connections to available family support resources. Personal information related to screening, assessment, treatment and case management is protected by applicable confidentiality laws.

A Closer Look At What We Do

Prevention & Intervention

FFDA funds and coordinates community-based prevention and early intervention programs for youth and adults. These efforts include the Student Assistance Program, school- and community-based education, awareness campaigns, and other evidence-informed programs designed to reduce substance use and related risks. FFDA also provides training and technical assistance to schools, employers and community organizations seeking to strengthen their prevention and early intervention efforts.

Overdose Prevention & Opioid Settlement Initiatives

Over the next two decades, Franklin County could receive as much as \$6.5 million to combat the ongoing opioid epidemic, thanks to two nationwide settlements with drug manufacturers, distributors and pharmacy chains. The Franklin County Commissioners, with recommendations from the Franklin/Fulton Drug and Alcohol Advisory Board and community stakeholders, are using those funds to fight the ongoing opioid epidemic. Naloxone Access

Free naloxone is available during normal business hours at community access points throughout Franklin County. For a list of current access points, visit www.franklincountypa.gov/departments/drug-and-alcohol. Fulton County residents can contact FFDA directly to arrange naloxone access. Organizations interested in hosting a naloxone access point or in scheduling an Operation Save a Life training, can contact FFDA directly. Funding for this program comes from the nationwide opioid settlement, with naloxone supplied at no cost through DDAP.

Problem Gambling Resources

FFDA can connect residents with information and resources related to problem gambling. Pennsylvania's Problem Gambling Helpline is free, confidential and available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Treatment & Case Management

FFDA provides free level-of-care assessments for youth and adults and helps uninsured or underinsured individuals determine whether they qualify for publicly funded treatment. FFDA can also help individuals with Medicaid or private insurance understand available treatment options and address potential gaps in coverage. Case managers coordinate care with licensed providers offering outpatient, residential and medication-based treatment for substance use disorders. They can also help individuals access related resources, including transportation, housing, food assistance and recovery supports. Staff can provide information and guidance to family members concerned about a loved one.

Recovery Support Services

Certified Recovery Specialists provide peer-based support to individuals in recovery or seeking recovery, including through a dedicated program within the Franklin County Jail that helps individuals build recovery skills before release. FFDA also leads Recovery-Oriented Systems of Care (ROSC) that works to strengthen community-wide recovery resources.

Recovery-Oriented Systems of Care & Community Coalition

FFDA supports United for Recovery and Prevention, a countywide coalition of Healthy Franklin County and local partners to prevent overdose and expand recovery resources. Franklin County has experienced a significant and sustained decline in fatal overdoses in recent years. This encouraging progress is thanks to extensive collaboration among county agencies, treatment and recovery organizations, first responders and community partners.

Justice-Involved Recovery Services

FFDA supports a range of justice-involved recovery initiatives that bring treatment and recovery resources directly into the justice system, including recovery support services for incarcerated individuals and programs that pair behavioral health support with community and law enforcement partners.
